Addendum: notes from a single page in 1950 – part of an application?

Interviewing: During the recent war my service included two years with the Military Intelligence Service. One year I worked as an interrogator, the other as interviewer.

Especially, the latter required careful investigation and extensive report writing. A considerable amount of usefulness depended upon the care and precision with which both the interrogation and the interviews were conducted and reported for these jobs at the Military Intelligence Training Center, Camp Ritchie, MD

Public Speaking: I am a fairly good speaker, having spoken on subjects touching on literature, world relations, UN, Jewish Affairs, United Jewish Appeal, and Zionist Affairs.

Newspaper Editing: I edited the newspaper on boat voyage back home after the military service. In 1946-47, I was the co-editor of the IZFA newspaper IZFACTS.

Hobbies: My hobbies include musical appreciation and playing. My reading is mostly in comparative literature in drama, politics, history and current events.

Work Experience: I worked at the Cleveland Hearing and Speech Center for two years, while working for my undergraduate degree. I did extensive work with children (ages 3-10) in group therapy for speech defects. I have also worked with young people in speech and hearing correction and education. Since this work was part of my education I naturally received no pay for it. The work, however, taught me valuable lessons in applied psychology, group work, interviewing of mothers and children, as well as adults. I was also introduced into the mechanics of agency administration, etc.
